Principal's Message:

The Jacaranda festivities start this Saturday October 29 with the March of the Youth where teachers will meet the children at the Civic Centre at 8:30am. The following Thursday November 3 is Jacaranda Thursday with school finishing at 1pm. Please note buses do not alter their timetable for the day and alternative pick-up arrangements will need to be made.

Years 3-6 have been completing check-in assessments in Reading and Numeracy with some pleasing results. We have seen a pleasing student growth in student vocabulary which was a teaching focus for term 3. Term 4 teaching focus is on Listening and Speaking focusing in students being able to express and support their ideas. Students need to be congratulated with their application to the assessments this year.

We have had a revamp of our whole school Positive Behaviour Strategy and as a result you will notice students being acknowledged at morning assembly for the positive behaviour they demonstrate continuously around the school. Each week there will be a new behaviour focus shared in the newsletter.

The attendance target for Westlawn Public School is to have 85% of students attending school 90% of the time. For the first semester of 2022 we had 45% of students attending 90% of the time. We will continue to share our progress and work with the community to improve student attendance.

Westlawn took on Maclean PS at JJ Lawrence Fields last Monday. Maclean won the toss and elected to bat. Westlawn bowled and fielded very well. Each bowler did a great job to bowl good line and length. The catching was top class with Digby, Toby and Lukas all taking absolute screamers. Maclean were bowled out in the 21st over with 82 runs on the board. A great result against a team that scored 162 runs in their last match. Wicket takers for Westlawn were Bailey (3), Jerrash (2), Lucas (1), Ethan (1), Toby (1), Chad(1) and Lukas (1).

The Westlawn innings started well with Jacob and Flynn facing up against outstanding bowling by the Maclean opening pair. Runs were hard to come by, but Jacob kept the scoring ticking over through singles and a boundary. Flynn did well to hang in for three overs before being caught for one run. Chad and Jacob combined well to take the score to 1 for 21 before Chad was caught for two runs. Lucas added 6 runs to the tally and Jacob was finally dismissed for 12 runs. Ethan got the scoreboard moving with 12 runs, Max made two runs, Jerrash went cheaply for one run and Lukas made three runs before being run out. Westlawn were in deep trouble at 8 for 42 with seven overs remaining. In the end, it was a bridge too far as Ryley (0 runs) and Bailey (2 runs) were both run out. Toby was left stranded, not out on 0. Westlawn were dismissed for 50 runs and knocked out of the competition.
